On December 25, 2021, the James Webb Space Telescope (JWST) lifted off from French Guyana on a 30 day journey toward a destination nearly one million miles from Earth. When fully operational later this year, this amazing machine will begin collecting images from the very beginning of the known physical universe -- nearly 14 billion years ago. Scientists expect the information collected from the JWST may rewrite our understanding of the formation of stars, and galaxies, and may provide key insights to the beginning of life on Earth, and possibly other worlds.
